- How to use *a / an* before a noun

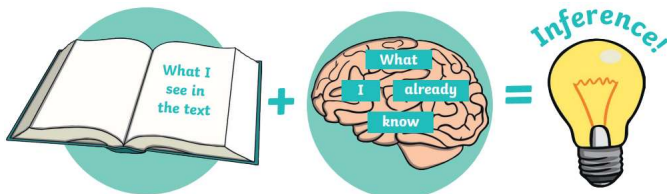
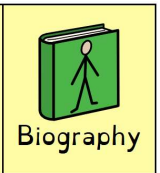
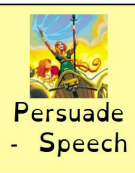
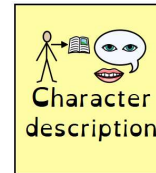
