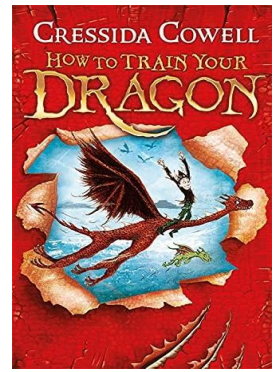

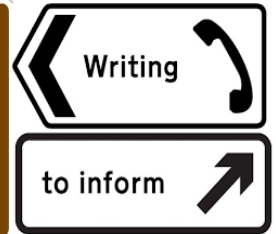


I already know...
